

OUR CLIENTELE

WoW supports forcibly displaced women residing in Utah. These women have been compelled to leave their homes due to conflict, persecution, human rights abuses, violence, or threats to their safety.

Since 2012, Utah has accepted individuals under various visa types, including over 8,500 refugees, according to data from the Utah Department of Health & Human Services. Despite being the 30th most populous state, Utah impressively ranks 11th for refugees accepted per capita. This demonstrates the state's commitment to welcoming those fleeing persecution, conflict, or adversity. refugee arrivals consistently form the largest group, with significant contributions from other visa categories. 

Karen came to Women of the World (WoW) seeking help with an overwhelming medical bill. Following surgery, she was burdened with a debt of \$599,988.52. Despite multiple attempts to resolve the issue, she was unable to make progress. Arriving at WoW in a wheelchair, she asked if we could intervene. We immediately took action, making several calls to the hospital. As a result, her bill was reduced to \$108,000—an improvement, but still an unaffordable amount.

We continued advocating on her behalf, and by mid-December, we received life-changing news: a foundation had covered the remaining balance. During our call with the hospital, when Karen learned that her bill had been reduced to zero, she broke into tears. It was a deeply emotional moment, and even the hospital agent remained silent as she wept with relief. Before the year ended, we referred Karen to a local nonprofit clinic, where she received vouchers to begin physiotherapy. She is now undergoing treatment and walking with two crutches. The clinic also referred her to Select Health, and she successfully applied for insurance, which will begin once she starts working.

Karen expressed deep gratitude to WoW, saying she doesn't know what she would have done without our help. We encouraged her to stay strong and focus on the positive because even in difficult times, hope remains.

In 2024, WoW's Economic Empowerment program continued to make meaningful strides in supporting our clients' journeys toward self-reliance. This year, we facilitated job placements for 56 clients, helping them secure positions with sustainable wages and benefits. Our employment specialists assisted with a record 353 job applications, supported college enrollment, and connected clients with English language programs to enhance their career prospects.

We are proud to report a growing number of clients securing jobs with health insurance, paid time off, and opportunities for career advancement. Our commitment to fostering professional development remains unwavering as we work to ensure each client is equipped with the tools and confidence needed to thrive. Through these efforts, WoW continues to uphold its mission of empowering forcibly displaced women to achieve economic independence and build brighter futures for themselves and their families.

Ghotai, a 32-year-old refugee, came to Women of the World (WoW) seeking help to find a more affordable apartment for her family. During her intake, she shared a deeper aspiration—to find work and use her skills in beadwork and embroidery. Immediately, we connected her with Craft Lake City, which sponsored her booth at their DIY Fest. With support from a Pashto-speaking staff member, Ghotai showcased her beautiful pieces and made her first income in the U.S.—a thrilling step toward self-reliance!

Since then, Ghotai has completed the Craft Lake City Business Academy, participated in a holiday market, and is also enrolled in English classes at SLCC, investing in her future. Ghotai's journey highlights WoW's holistic approach: securing stable housing, expanding education, and launching careers. By creating pathways for lasting economic empowerment, we ensure women like Ghotai can build independent, thriving lives.

When we first met Magali, she was unemployed and uncertain about her future. Through our Economic Empowerment Program Coaching, Magali gained the tools and confidence to turn her situation around. We helped her explore her skills and interests, crafted a professional resume, and provided interview coaching, including strategies for following up after interviews.

With the support of WoW, Magali graduated with honors from MTech's Digital Marketing and Analytics program. Soon after, she secured a fulfilling job as a "Human Trafficking Support Housing Specialist" with the Asian Association of Utah.



SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Our Scholarships are central to the goals and values of Independence and Economic Success

Women of the World understands that overcoming the financial barrier to higher education is crucial for success. Our scholarship provides financial support to those who may not qualify for traditional aid. In 2023, WoW awarded 32 scholarships to forcibly displaced women seeking to improve their lives through education.

The Community Development Program at WoW is centered on the expertise and perspectives of our case managers and clients. The vision of this program is to complement and extend case management services by building community and belonging through education, group activities, & mentoring. We address challenges identified by the communities we serve through initiatives that provide more accessible and impactful solutions than individual case management alone. These initiatives make our events stand out from others in the Salt Lake Area.

Our events and workshops are centered around our client's needs and concerns, which inform how we prepare for each event, and particularly what topics are chosen. We identify these needs through direct client feedback on post-event surveys, client requests, as well as the frequency in types of cases we see in our customized service program.

Topics covered in 2024:

- Health: Nutrition, Yoga, Mental Health & Wellness, Art Therapy, Opioid Epidemic, Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault, Pregnancy, Birth Control & Family Planning, Oral Health, Breast Cancer Awareness, and Medicaid.
- Transportation: UTA services, trip planning, UTA costs vs other transportation options, etc.
- Financial Literacy: Banking 101, Personal Budgeting, Credit Card Tips
- Laws and Rights: Divorce & Custody, Law in Daily Life, Basic Medical Rights, Worker's Rights and Disability, Immigration
- Youth Education: Girls in STEM: paleontology, robotics, science history, biology, etc.



Beyond the Data Stories that Inspire

In 2024 we had the majority of workshops focused on some aspect of health. As case managers, we see how our clients' health drastically impacts their ability to succeed in every other aspect of their lives, which is why we focused on this topic so heavily.

In July we held a unique workshop for our clients focused on Breast Cancer Awareness. We partnered with PreventHer, another local organization centered on teaching refugee and immigrant women about breast cancer, and the Huntsman Institute of Cancer. A special addition to this workshop was having one of our clients, a former OBG/YN in her country, give us a detailed explanation and demonstration of how both self-exams and clinical exams are performed. She did this in both English and her native language, Farsi. Having this client share her expertise as both a medical professional and a forcibly displaced woman now living in Utah was empowering to the participants who could feel understood by a woman with lived experiences, fears, and cultural adjustments, just like them.

Workshops like this one exemplify our commitment to empowering women at critical points in their resettlement journeys. We know that traditional and existing resources do not address the barriers that our clients in particular face, which is why we work diligently to provide as many quality opportunities to our women as possible. Forcibly displaced women deserve the chance to learn, grow, and achieve their full potential with support to overcome and navigate the difficult circumstances and additional challenges they face.



ANNUAL EVENTS



14TH FASHION SHOW AND CULTURAL GALA

The Women of the World Fashion Show & Cultural Gala is our biggest fundraising event of the year. It allows Utahns to learn about their new neighbors who add diversity to our state. We hold this event the same week as International Women's Day and give our clients a chance to showcase their rich culture and highlight their dreams. This year we raised more donations than ever for our programs--a tremendous success!

MOTHER'S DAY

We love celebrating our fabulous and hardworking mothers. Each year we highlight deserving women as our "Mother of the Year" to honor all the hard work they have accomplished over the year. This year we recognized two moms, our client Evelyn for utilizing a support network to change her circumstances to better support her children, and Margret for overcoming health challenges while caring for her family and completing her CNA certification.





CELEBRATION OF SUCCESS

At the end of each year, we celebrate women who achieve self-reliance goals. Recognizing even the smallest steps toward independence inspires the entire community. Local government and business leaders join us in honoring their achievements. This year, we recognized more than 35 women for starting jobs, getting promotions, launching businesses, or graduating from college. We also celebrated the volunteers who supported these women, emphasizing the collective effort behind their successes.



VOLUNTEERING AT WOW

In 2024, volunteers played a vital role in advancing Women of the World's mission, supporting forcibly displaced women on their path to self-reliance. They contributed thousands of hours across programs, including English conversation labs, mentorship, childcare, and major community events. Volunteers also served as ambassadors, connecting women with resources, recruiting new supporters, and inspiring donor engagement.

A significant portion of volunteer time supported English programs, helping clients build confidence and communication skills. Hundreds of hours of conversational English practice were provided through mentorships and conversation labs. A new beginner English class was launched with the help of a volunteer, offering participants guidance and encouragement. Weekly conversation labs, now held four days a week, were supported by a dedicated group of volunteers.

More than supporters, volunteers are changemakers, creating lasting connections and fostering hope. Their dedication empowers clients to thrive, transforming challenges into opportunities for brighter futures. **Thank you to all our volunteers from the bottom of our hearts!**




